

I. Educate Your Community About Israeli Life, Culture and Society

This is an opportunity to witness hisime and engage with one of the most complex and consequential issues of our time. On this Journey, participants gain firsthand insights from influential voices across the spectrum – Israelis, Palestinians, Israeli-Arabs, and leaders in coexistence projects – as well as institutions at the heart of Israel's thriving startup ecosystem.

In a time when our world feels increasingly divided, this Journey provides a space for reflection, learning, and growth. It also offers something deeply personal: a chance to connect with the spiritual and cultural richness of a region that serves as the birthplace of Judaism, Christianity, and Islam.

1. Israeli Culture Night

Event Concept: Host an event showcasing Israeli food, music, dance and art. Include a presentation and conversation on Israel's history, its modern cultural landscape, and its diverse communities. **Be sure to share about your REALITY experience, its impact on your life, and how it helped inspire this project!**

Discussion Topics:

- Israel's Cultural Diversity: The complex and diverse communities in Israel, including Jewish, Arab, Druze, and other groups, and how they shape the country's identity.
- **Cultural Fusion and Innovation:** How Israel's history and the blending of cultures contribute to its modern cultural landscape, including art, music, and cuisine.
- Social and Political Influences on Culture: Understanding how Israel's social, political, and historical context informs its artistic expression, fashion, and music.
- The Role of Tradition and Modernity in Israeli Culture: Exploring the balance between preserving traditions and embracing innovation in Israel's cultural and artistic practices.

Activities:

- A live cooking demonstration featuring Israeli dishes from different regions.
- Traditional and contemporary Israeli music performances or dance showcases.
- An interactive art exhibit or live painting that reflects Israeli culture.
- A presentation or panel discussion about Israel's cultural diversity, including Jewish, Arab, and Druze communities.

Goal: Educate attendees about Israel's rich and diverse cultural identity, while creating a fun and interactive environment for them to experience Israeli culture firsthand.

2. Israeli Film Screening and Discussion

Event Concept: Organize a screening to showcase a film that has an Israeli theme, or explores aspects of Israeli society or history. After the screening, host a discussion panel with experts or alumni to provide insights and explore the cultural context. **Be sure to share about your REALITY experience, its impact on your life, and how it helped inspire this project!**

Discussion Topics:

3. Israeli Cuisine Workshop

Event Concept: Offer a cooking class that teaches participants how to make traditional Israeli dishes while discussing Israel's culinary traditions and their connection to various communities within Israel. **Be sure to share about your REALITY experience, its impact on your life, and how it helped inspire this project!**

Discussion Topics:

4. Israeli Fashion and Design Showcase



Event Concept: Host an event highlighting Israeli designers or products. Participants learn about Israel's thriving fashion, design, and technology industries, while engaging in dialogue about Israel's innovative culture. **Be sure to share about your REALITY experience, its impact on your life, and how it helped inspire this project!**

Discussion Topics:

- The intersection of fashion and technology in Israel, and how this unique combination drives innovation in design.
- The influence of Israel's diverse cultures and communities on its fashion and design industries.
- How Israeli designers are blending tradition with modernity to create globally recognized trends.
- The role of sustainability and ethical practices in Israeli fashion and design.
- Personal reflections on how the *REALITY* experience shaped an understanding of Israel's innovative approach to design and its cultural significance.

Activities:

- A display of Israeli-designed clothing, accessories, and products, with live discussions about the trends and inspirations shaping Israeli fashion.
- A workshop where participants can create a piece of art or design inspired by Israeli fashion.
- A presentation by an Israeli designer or entrepreneur about how innovation drives Israel's fashion and tech sectors.

Goal: Introduce attendees to the cutting-edge, creative industries in Israel and how innovation and design are central to Israeli society.

5. Israel Beyond the Headlines Panel

Event Concept: Organize a discussion with Israeli experts, journalists, or alumni who can provide an in-depth look at aspects of Israeli life not often covered in mainstream media. Topics could include Israeli LGBTQIA+ rights, the role of women in Israeli society, or Israeli environmental initiatives. **Be sure to share about your REALITY experience, its impact on your life, and how it helped inspire this project!**

Discussion Topics:

- The complexities of Israeli LGBTQIA+ rights and the evolving social climate.
- The role of women in Israeli society, exploring achievements, challenges, and ongoing struggles for equality.
- Innovative Israeli environmental initiatives and how they address regional and global challenges.
- The impact of minority communities in shaping Israel's political and social landscape.

Activities:

- A panel discussion featuring experts or alumni sharing insights and personal experiences about lesser-known aspects of Israeli society.
- A Q&A session with the panel where attendees can ask about topics such as minority rights, Israel's political landscape or social movements.

6. Israeli Literature Reading and Book Club

7. Virtual Reality Tour of Israel

2. Israeli Politics and Democracy: A Conversation Across Divides

- How Israel's political system balances the needs of its diverse population, including Jews, Arabs and other represented groups in Israel.
- The role of the Israeli government in shaping domestic and international policies.
- The challenges of maintaining a democracy in a region comprised of many different religious and cultural groups.

Activities:

- Discussions with speakers from various political backgrounds in Israel (right-wing, left-wing, centrist, and Palestinian citizens of Israel) to discuss Israel's political system.
- Organize a series of small group discussions where attendees can reflect on how Israel's political system navigates its diverse society.
- Facilitate a debate on the challenges and opportunities of maintaining a democracy in such a multicultural society.

Goal: Provide a platform for understanding the diverse political perspectives within Israel and foster deeper conversations about balancing democracy, identity, and governance.

3. Israel and the Global Jewish Community: Diverse Views on Identity
